EUCHARISTIC ADORATION AND HOLY HOUR

"Do you know more about the faith than you did a year ago? Most people are not called to a formal study of the faith; but we are all called to learn a little more each week, month, and year. For years I have been encouraging people to read five pages of a great spiritual book each day."

REDISCOVER THE SAINTS - by Matthew Kelly

We have our little black books and the books which are a gift of your parish...and peace and quiet from 2:00-5:00pm on Thursday at Cathedral for adoration. Perfect. Bring your book and thoughts you'd like to share with the Lord. He waits. Come when you can; leave when you must.

WEEKLY MEDITATION

This week the Gospel of Matthew shows the transfiguration of Jesus. Having brought Peter, James and John up the mountain, the Lord is revealed in his heavenly glory - surrounded by Moses and Elijah - as the Father's voice booms out: *"This is my beloved Son, listen to him!"*

For a brief moment the disciples see Jesus as he stands in Heaven. Together with great figures from salvation history, Jesus displays the power and authority he has as the Son of God. It is inspirational, terrifying, awesome and mighty.

It's also very brief.

The moment fades, and the fear experienced by the disciples passes away as the Lord tells them not to be afraid, but rather to tell no one of the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.

There are times in life when we face tremendous obstacles, challenges that test us to the extreme. In the midst of difficulty we sometimes get a short reprieve - a moment where we can pause, step back, and see the big picture - so that we can keep our perspective and understand why we do what we do.

The transfiguration is one of those short pauses where the three disciples gain an insight into who Jesus is and what he must accomplish. As we engage the struggles of our lives, may we experience moments of God's presence, empowering us to keep going in the face of adversity.

The people who we are able to serve are much more important than any numbers we provide. We wish to let you know how much your support and our volunteers are able to touch the lives of those in our community. In February we had contact with 146 households. Many of those individuals were able to be served through information and referral. We had 30 office visits and 13 home visits. We helped those in need with approximately \$2,000 in rental assistance and \$2,000 in motel stays when shelters were full. \$1,100 was distributed in transportation assistance (bus tickets, bus passes, gas etc.). The total amount distributed was \$5,189. Approximately \$1,300 worth of food, household goods, clothing and furniture was distributed by our volunteers.
