Our new parish church building project is still moving forward. The building committee had a meeting this week to review the revised building prints and make necessary changes. The architect will now the revisions and the prints forwarded to Father Andrew and Bishop Powers for their approval. After we receive the approvals, we will schedule a time in the parish hall for parishioners to view the prints and ask questions. We are currently looking at a late August or early September for a start date of construction.

To date, we have received \$530,00 in pledges and have received payments on the pledges of \$334,000. For those who have still not made a pledge, we ask that you seriously consider it. - **Gospel** - Christ invites us to put Him first in our lives
