## WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's take a quick look at a sketch of the readings:

- **1st Reading** – Forgive your neighbor, so that the Lord will forgive you
- **Psalm** – “The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion.”
- **2nd Reading** – We live and die for the Lord
- **Gospel** – We forgive others, just as our Father forgives us

On one hand the teaching is simple: if you want to be forgiven by God, start forgiving one another. It's sound logic and makes complete sense...until you have something hard to forgive. Perhaps we have felt slighted or neglected, been hurt or experienced disappointment. Maybe we just don't understand, or maybe we are choosing to interpret a situation in its worst possible light.

Forgiveness is the practical dimension of Christian love. After all, it's easy to love people when we are comfortable, rested, calm and free of all distractions. The real test of our love happens when we can forgive one another in the light of Jesus Christ.

The Lord offers us the teaching of forgiveness with clarity and conviction. There is no middle ground. We forgive one another if we expect God to forgive us of our own sins. We forgive, knowing that we all stand in need of God's forgiveness, so that by unlocking the gates of our hearts through forgiveness we can stand before the Lord ready to receive the grace of his mercy.

Two thoughts then emerge today:

1. Who do I need to forgive?
2. To whom do I need to apologize and ask for forgiveness?

May the Lord inspire us to be people of forgiveness as we practice his teaching and follow his example.

**Question for Children:** Jesus says we should forgive from our heart. When did you ask forgiveness of someone you hurt? How did you feel?

**Question for Youth:** Jesus challenges us to forgive. Who needs your forgiveness? From whom do you need to ask forgiveness?

**Question for Adults:** Jesus tells us to forgive seventy times seven, which means always and forever. Name a time this

past week when you forgave someone. Name, too, a time when you accepted another person's forgiveness.

## Today is National Grandparents Day!

We invite you to use this blessing when your family gathers together:

### BLESSING OF GRANDPARENTS

*This blessing may be used at special family visits (such as holidays), at the beginning or end of a visit, or at another appropriate time. If possible, the oldest grandchild might serve as the leader.*

**When the grandparents, parents, and children have gathered, all make the sign of the cross.**

Leader: Blessed be God, who is faithful through all generations.

R/. Blessed be God forever.

**The leader introduces the blessing in these or similar words:**

Grandparents are cherished members of our family. They bring gifts of wisdom, experience, and love and share with us their life of faith. We thank God for their example and ask that he bless them with happiness and good health.





**Then the Scripture is read:**

Listen to the words of Psalm 128:  
Happy are you who fear the Lord,  
who walk in his ways!  
For you shall eat the fruit of your handiwork;  
happy shall you be, and favored.  
Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine  
in the recesses of your home;  
Your children like olive plants  
around your table.  
Behold, thus is the man blessed  
who fears the Lord.  
The Lord bless you from Zion:  
may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem  
all the days of your life.  
May you see your children's children.  
Peace be upon Israel!

Reader: The Word of the Lord.  
R/. Thanks be to God.

intercession and in the Lord's Prayer. Then  
the leader prays:**

bless our grandparents with long life,  
happiness, and health.  
May they remain constant in your love  
and be living signs of your presence  
to their children and grandchildren.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord.  
R/. Amen  
All make the sign of the cross as the leader  
concludes:  
May God bless us and keep us  
all the days of our lives.  
R/. Amen
