WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's take a look at some of the main themes of the readings for the 2nd Sunday of Easter.

1st Reading – Acts 4:32-35

- The Early Church shares all things in common; no one suffers from grave need.
- The apostles offer their witness to the resurrection of Christ; they are filled with great power.

Psalm - 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24

- The "stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone" now applies to Jesus.
- Christ was rejected, and submitted to the agony of the Cross; Christ's resurrection now becomes the cornerstone of our faith in God.
- Our strength and courage from the Lord, who is our savior.

2nd Reading - 1 John 5:1-6

- Everyone who believes in Christ is empowered to love God and one another. Our love for the Lord empowers us to keep his commandments.
- Our faith in Christ leads to a victory that conquers the world.

Gospel - John 20:19-31

- Jesus appears to the disciples, offering them peace and the Holy Spirit.
- Jesus appears to the disciples (this time with Thomas) and speaks about those who have not seen the Risen Lord but who in faith overcome their doubt and believe.

Divine Mercy Sunday

St. Faustina, a Polish nun, was gifted with mystical visions of our Lord Jesus. Her diary records her dialogue with Jesus as He proclaimed His message of mercy, including these 2 quotes from her diary:

"Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All the works of My hands are crowned with mercy." (No. 301)

"I realize more and more how much every soul needs God's mercy throughout life and particularly at the hour of death. This chaplet (of Divine Mercy) mitigates God's anger, as He Himself told me." (No. 1036)

Divine Mercy Sunday falls on the first Sunday after Easter, this year on Sunday, April 11th. Because of a First Communion Mass happening that afternoon in the Cathedral, we will celebrate Divine Mercy with a 30-minute livestream on Sunday, April 11th, from the Cathedral. The livestream will start with a rosary at 12:00 noon and end at 12:30 p.m. with the divine mercy chaplet starting at 12:20 p.m., and a few words about Divine Mercy in between.

We are a people surrounded by oceans of mercy, which brings great hope and comfort. Spend a half an hour of mercy with this livestream.





Divine Mercy Sunday-The Second Sunday of Easter

APRIL 11, 2021

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).
