#### **EARLY HEAD START / HEAD START PROGRAMS**

**PARENTS:** The Early Head Start / Head Start programs are now accepting applications for the 2021-2022 program year. Our Early Head Start home visiting program serves prenatal women and children birth to 3 years of age. Our Early Head Start Center based program serves infants from 6 weeks old up to 35 months. Our Head Start program serves 3k and 4k children and provides services to children with disabilities. Superior Head Start centers are authorized Community Preschool Sites (4K). Our centers in Superior offer a variety of options, from part-day five days a week for 4 hours to extended-days four days a week for 7 hours per day. Transportation is available to families within the city limits who are selected into the part-day classrooms. Applications can be obtained at the administrative office at 1507 Tower Avenue, Suite 312, phone 715-392-9896, Head Start Center #1 at 1500 North 34th Street, Suite 400, phone 715-392-6286 or Head Start Center #2 at 518 Grand Avenue, phone 715-392-9848. Families can start the application process online at www.familyforum.org. Parents or guardians must provide proof of income such as income tax forms, W-2 forms or paycheck stubs when applying. The most recent copy of the child's immunization and the child's birth certificate is also needed. Income eligibility is required.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

During these challenging times, supporting our parish and Diocesan programs has absolutely been a priority. The U.S. Bishops' Subcommittee on Catholic Home Missions is a grant-making agency that has helped. It offers financial support to missionary activities that strengthen the Catholic Church in the United States through its annual fundraising campaign, the Catholic Home Missions Appeal – April 24 and 25, 2021. The CHM Appeal educates American Catholics about mission needs and invites them to assist fellow Catholics in the practice of the faith.

Catholic Home Mission is a designation that used to describe a Diocese like ours that has few resources available to provide basic pastoral services without outside support. Basic pastoral services include Mass, the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, and laypeople. Right now, over 40% of dioceses in the United States and its territories are considered home missions.

I ask that you prayerfully consider participating in the CHM Appeal by mailing your designated donation envelope provided by your parish to your parish office or give it through your parish online portal if it's an option. Through your generosity, many churches over the years have been able to keep their doors open and provide essential pastoral services.

This past year, thanks to our generous collection response, the United States Bishops' Committee on the Home Missions awarded the Diocese of Superior \$125,000 for Lay Formation and Leadership Development, Seminary Education support, Priestly Education, and Diaconate Formation. With your support, the CHM Appeal can continue to provide essential pastoral outreach here in our Diocesan parishes.



Praise be to you, our Lord, God of all Creation!



## THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER



Parents play the primary role in educating their children about sexual abuse. Here are 5 tips for teaching safety to the little ones God has entrusted to you:

## 1: Keep it practical.

Teach your children the differences between safe touches and unsafe touches.

## 2: Tell your children that saying "no" is okay.

Empower your children to say "no" if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable or touches them inappropriately.

#### 3: Give your children a way to alert you.

Tell your children they can use an excuse or share a special "code-word" with you to to alert you about an unsafe person or situation.

#### 4: Tell your children to report an unsafe touch.

Let your children know they should tell you if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe around any adult or peer. You can also identify other adults they can tell about unsafe touches.

#### 5: Tell your children you trust them.

If your child makes a report to you, believe him or her. Tell them it is not their fault and that you love them. Immediately bring the allegation to the attention of public authorities.
