### 1st Reading - Sirach 3:17-18,20,28-29

- We find favor with God when we conduct our affairs with humility.
- Aware of our limitations, we cultivate wisdom and give alms.

### Psalm - 68:4-7,10-11

- "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor."
- We rejoice in the Lord, who protects those in need.

### 2nd Reading - Hebrews 12:18-19,22-24a

- We approach God in Mount Zion, surrounded by angels and the assembly of heaven.
- Jesus is the mediator of the new covenant, made possible through his blood.

### Gospel - Luke 14:1,7-14

- Jesus uses the opportunity at a banquet to teach about humility and care for others.
- "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

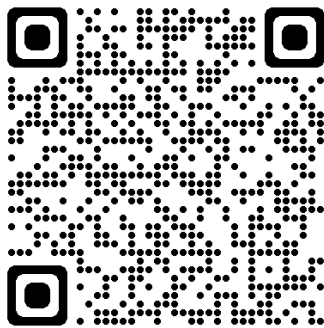

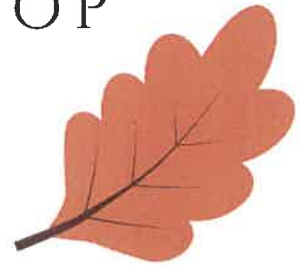

## **ALPHA COURSE**

**Our cluster will be running two different Alpha Courses, beginning in September:**

St. Anthony, Lake Nebagamon – beginning Sunday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at 6pm

Cathedral (Kress Hall) – beginning Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> at 6pm

**What is an Alpha Course?** Alpha is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, typically run over eleven weeks. Each session looks at a different question around faith and designed to create conversation. Alpha is run all around the globe, and everyone is welcome!

### **What happens at an Alpha Course?**

Food – Food brings us together, whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table or catching up over a cup of coffee. It's no different at an Alpha Course. We start with food, because it's a great way to encourage community and get to know each other.

Presentation – The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. About 30 minutes long, they explore some of the big issues around the Christian faith and unpack the basics, addressing questions such as “Who is Jesus?” and “How can we have Faith?”

Conversation – This is a crucial part of the Alpha Course, offering everyone a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, while discussing it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment

### **How long does each session last?**

Two hours. Our two courses begin with a 30-minute block of time for food and fellowship, followed by a 30-minute presentation and then an hour for conversation. We know that people are all busy, and we respect your obligations.

### **Is there a fee?**

There is no cost.

### **Who can attend?**

Anyone! The Alpha Course is for people who want to meet people and discuss some of the big questions of faith and life in a warm and welcoming environment. You don't have to be Catholic (or even Christian) to attend; in fact, it's better when a wide range of backgrounds are present...it makes the discussion richer.

### **How do I sign up to attend?**

Please call the parish office and leave the names of those who are planning to attend.
