WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's take a look at some of the themes in the readings for the 23rd Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Wisdom 9:13-18b

- Our limitations often prevent us from knowing what the Lord intends.
- God does, however, give us wisdom and the Holy Spirit to instruct us.

Psalm - 90:3-6,12-17

- "In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge."
- We recognize our limitations and we call upon the Lord for help.

2nd Reading - Philemon 1:9-10,12-17

- Paul, now an old man, urges the proper care of Onesimus, a runaway slave.

Gospel - Luke 14:25-33

- Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after Jesus cannot be his disciple.
- We renounce the power of possessions in our lives as we follow the Lord.

Question for Children: Jesus says that in order to be one of his followers, we must be close to him. When do you feel closest to Jesus?

Question for Youth: Jesus tells his disciples that they must renounce their possessions in order to be His disciple. If you had to, could you leave everything behind to be with God? What would hold you back? How much of a struggle would it be?

Question for Adults: Today's Gospel is demanding. How do you as a modern man or woman "denounce your possessions?" What does this mean for you?



ALPHA COURSE

Our cluster will be running two different Alpha Courses, beginning in September:

St. Anthony, Lake Nebagamon – beginning Sunday, September 4th at 6pm

Cathedral (Kress Hall) – beginning Thursday, September 8th at 6pm

What is an Alpha Course? Alpha is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, typically run over eleven weeks. Each session looks at a different question around faith and designed to create conversation. Alpha is run all around the globe, and everyone is welcome!

What happens at an Alpha Course?

Food – Food brings us together, whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table or catching up over a cup of coffee. It's no different at an Alpha Course. We start with food, because it's a great way to encourage community and get to know each other.

Presentation – The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. About 30 minutes long, they explore some of the big issues around the Christian faith and unpack the basics, addressing questions such as "Who is Jesus?" and "How can we have Faith?"

Conversation – This is a crucial part of the Alpha Course, offering everyone a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, while discussing it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment

How long does each session last?

Two hours. Our two courses begin with a 30-minute block of time for food and fellowship, followed by a 30-minute presentation and then an hour for conversation. We know that people are all busy, and we respect your obligations.

Is there a fee?

There is no cost.

Who can attend?

Anyone! The Alpha Course is for people who want to meet people and discuss some of the big questions of faith and life in a warm and welcoming environment. You don't have to be Catholic (or even Christian) to attend; in fact, it's better when a wide range of backgrounds are present...it makes the discussion richer.
