1st Reading - Amos 8:4-7

- The prophet Amos lists a number of ways that the
 needy have been harmed.
- The Lord will not forget the evil that people have
 done to those in need.

- "Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor."
- The Lord, who is enthroned on high, raises the lowly.

2nd Reading - 1st Timothy 2:1-8
