WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's take a look at some of the themes in the readings for the 23rd Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Wisdom 9:13-18b

- Our limitations often prevent us from knowing what the Lord intends.

ALPHA COURSE

Our cluster will be running two different Alpha Courses, beginning in September: St. Anthony, Lake Nebagamon – beginning Sunday, September 4th at 6pm Cathedral (Kress Hall) – beginning Thursday, September 8th at 6pm

What is an Alpha Course? Alpha is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, typically run over eleven weeks. Each session looks at a different question around faith and designed to create conversation. Alpha is run all around the globe, and everyone is welcome!

What happens at an Alpha Course?

<u>Food</u> – Food brings us together, whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table or catching up over a cup of coffee. It's no different at an Alpha Course. We start with food, because it's a great way to encourage community and get to know each other.

<u>Presentation</u> – The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. About 30 minutes long, they explore some of the big issues around the Christian faith and unpack the basics, addressing questions such as "Who is Jesus?" and "How can we have Faith?"

<u>Conversation</u> – This is a crucial part of the Alpha Course, offering everyone a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, while discussing it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment

How long does each session last?

Two hours. Our two courses begin with a 30-minute block of time for food and fellowship, followed by a 30-minute presentation and then an hour for conversation. We know that people are all busy, and we respect your obligations.

Is there a fee?

There is no cost.

Who can attend?

Anyone! The Alpha Course is for people who want to meet people and discuss some of the big questions of faith and life in a warm and welcoming environment. You don't have to be Catholic (or even Christian) to attend; in fact, it's better when a wide range of backgrounds are present...it makes the discussion richer.
