## **ALPHA COURSE**

Our cluster will be running two different Alpha Courses, beginning in September: St. Anthony, Lake Nebagamon – beginning Sunday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at 6pm Cathedral (Kress Hall) – beginning Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> at 6pm

What is an Alpha Course? Alpha is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, typically run over eleven weeks. Each session looks at a different question around faith and designed to create conversation. Alpha is run all around the globe, and everyone is welcome!

#### What happens at an Alpha Course?

<u>Food</u> – Food brings us together, whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table or catching up over a cup of coffee. It's no different at an Alpha Course. We start with food, because it's a great way to encourage community and get to know each other.

<u>Presentation</u> – The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. About 30 minutes long, they explore some of the big issues around the Christian faith and unpack the basics, addressing questions such as "Who is Jesus?" and "How can we have Faith?"

<u>Conversation</u> – This is a crucial part of the Alpha Course, offering everyone a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, while discussing it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment

#### How long does each session last?

Two hours. Our two courses begin with a 30-minute block of time for food and fellowship, followed by a 30-minute presentation and then an hour for conversation. We know that people are all busy, and we respect your obligations.

#### Is there a fee?

There is no cost.

#### Who can attend?

Anyone! The Alpha Course is for people who want to meet people and discuss some of the big questions of faith and life in a warm and welcoming environment. You don't have to be Catholic (or even Christian) to attend; in fact, it's better when a wide range of backgrounds are present...it makes the discussion richer.

#### How do I sign up to attend?

- "I will rise and go to my father."
- We call upon the Lord for mercy, cleansing us from our guilt and creating a clean heart within us.

### 2nd Reading - 1st Timothy 1:12-17

• Once a blasphemer who was a persecutor and arrogant, now mercifully treated by God's grace.

• The author reveals God's goodness: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners!

#### Gospel - Luke 15:1-32

• Jesus offers three parables: a man with a hundred sheep; a woman with ten coins; the Prodigal Son. The Lord shows how heaven rejoices when we repent of our sins and turn back to God.

**Question for Children:** The father in this story welcomed his son home, even after he ran away and did bad things. How do you know God welcomes you after you do that?

**Question for Adults:** When you wander away from being true to your faith, how do you know God will take you back? What signs do you see?
