Here are some of the themes in the readings for the 28th Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - 2nd Kings 5:14-17

- Naaman, a foreigner from Syria, is cured of his leprosy after he carries out the command of Elisha to bathe seven times in the Jordan river.
- Elisha will take no gift for this miracle, and Naaman now worships only the Lord.

Psalm - 98:1-4

- "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power."
- Rejoice, for all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of God.

2nd Reading - 2nd Timothy 2:8-13

- Paul contrasts the chains he wears with the power of the word of God, which is not chained.
- We persevere in faith, trusting in the eternal glory and power of Christ, who remains faithful.

Gospel - Luke 17:11-19

- Jesus cures ten lepers, one of whom is a foreigner...a Samaritan.
- The foreigner alone gives praise to God and returns to thank Jesus.

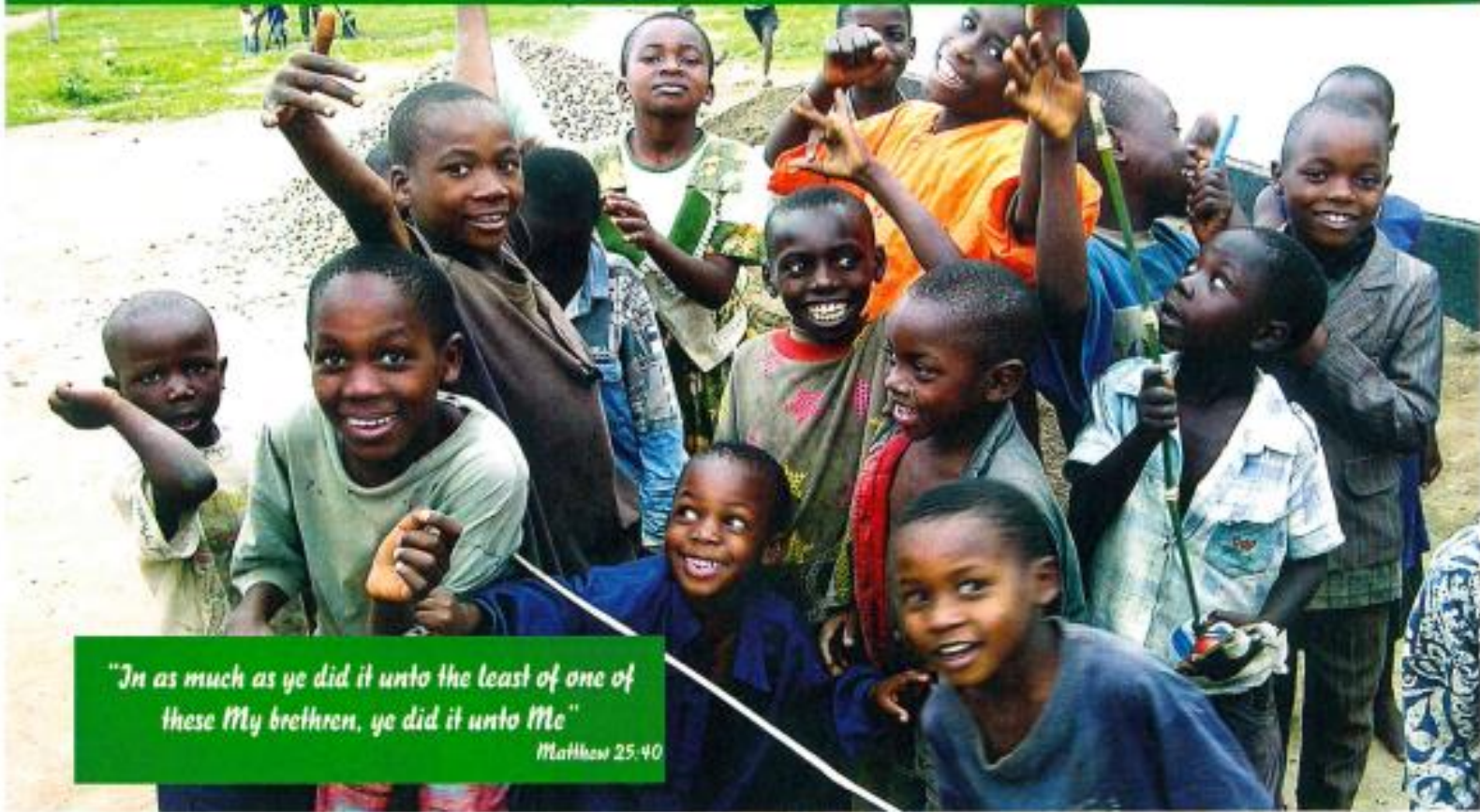

The Diocese of Superior is bound by civil and canon law to report sexual abuse of a minor to civil authorities. Anyone who believes that they have been sexually abused is strongly encouraged to report as well.
