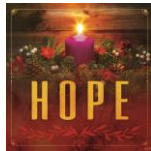

## WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes that surface in the readings for the 1st Sunday of Advent.

### 1st Reading - Isaiah 2:1-5

- The mountain of the Lord shall be the highest mountain, and people shall come toward it.
- On this mountain will be peace among the nations.

### Psalm - 122: 1-9

- "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."
- We rejoice and pray that Jerusalem is a city of peace and prosperity.



### 2nd Reading - Romans 13:11-14

- The hour is at hand to awake from sleep; salvation is at hand.
- We put on the Lord Jesus Christ, throwing off the works of darkness and putting on the armor of light.

### Gospel - Matthew 24:37-44

- Referring to the time of Noah, Jesus urges the people to be ready for the coming of the Son of Man.
- Christ calls us to be prepared, for at an unexpected hour the Son of Man will come.

## **RCIA**

### WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – RCIA – is a process of the Catholic Church designed to help adults to become fully initiated, practicing Catholics.



Who should participate in RCIA?

RCIA is open to many:

- To those who have not been baptized in any Christian faith;
- Those who have been baptized in another denomination but are being called to be Catholic;
- Those who have been baptized but not fully initiated through Confirmation and Eucharist;
- Those who have received sacraments but have been away from the Church;
- Those who are practicing their Catholic faith but desire to know more. The common factor among these groups is the desire to know, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ through his Holy Catholic Church.

What does the process entail?

In the cluster that includes Cathedral of Christ the King, Holy Assumption, St. Anthony (Superior), St. Anthony (Lake Nebagamon), and St. William (Foxboro), RCIA includes two-hour weekly sessions on Thursday evenings. Individuals meet as a group with a dedicated team of adults. Each evening includes Scripture, a Catechism topic, and other interesting facets of the Church.

Does participation mean commitment?

Choosing to participate in the Thursday RCIA sessions does not mean that an individual has fully committed to the Catholic Church. Rather, the sessions are designed to assist individuals through the discernment process. No one commits until they are ready. That may take a few months or maybe a few years.

What's the first step?

When does RCIA begin?

The first session is Thursday, December 1. The group meets from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in Kress Hall.

## **SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL**

HELPING THE HOMELESS



Our Society collaborates with our area shelters, the police department, and social services to provide shelter for those who are facing homelessness. We meet with those in need to consider helping with short-term shelter in a motel when shelters are full. We assisted with an average of over \$4000 a month in the past six months on motel stays. The amount per month is greater in the winter months, as we can often assist people in staying in their vehicles or at campgrounds when shelters are full. Many of the households we have served have had children, including infants. Many have had disabling medical conditions. Your generous donations have allowed us to provide this lifesaving care to our brothers and sisters. You have made a true difference in their lives!
