Here are some of the themes for the readings for the 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the Year.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading – 2<sup>nd</sup> Maccabees 7:1-2,9-14

- Seven brothers and their mother are being tortured in an attempt to force them to eat pork (an unclean meat) in violation of the law of Moses.
- As the fourth brother dies, he professes his hope in the resurrection.

### Psalm – 17:1,5-6,8,15

- “Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full.”
- We call upon the Lord to protect us and direct our path.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 2<sup>nd</sup> Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

### Gospel – Luke 20:27-38

- The Sadducees attempt to trap Jesus about a question regarding the resurrection.


