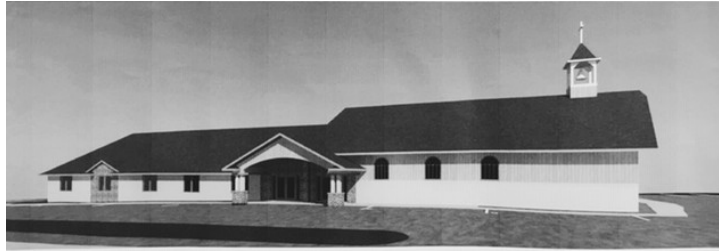



WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes in the readings for the 33rd Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Malachi 3:19-20a

- A day comes when evildoers will be like stubble set on fire, and nothing will remain.
- Those who fear the Lord's name, however, will be arise in the light of the sun.

Psalm - 98:5-9

- "The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice."
- We praise and sing before the one who rules the earth.

2nd Reading - 2nd Thessalonians 3:7-12

- Paul offers his own example as a model for the Christian community.
- "If anyone was unwilling to work, that one should not eat."

Gospel - Luke 21:5-19

- Jesus speaks about the destruction of the Temple, as well as signs and plagues among the nations. The Lord also says that his followers will be persecuted, exhorting them to persevere.

Question for Children: Jesus teaches us that work is good for us. What kind of work do you do during the week? How does it help you?

Question for Youth: Jesus tells us that even though bad things will happen, we are safe in God. When have you felt the safety of God's life in your own life?

Question for Adults: Paul's words to the Thessalonians are tough: if you want to eat, you must work! How does this translate into our society today? How do you reconcile this with Jesus' command to love and feed the poor?

WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – RCIA – is a process of the Catholic Church designed to help adults to become fully initiated, practicing Catholics.

Who should participate in RCIA?

RCIA is open to many:

- To those who have not been baptized in any Christian faith;
- Those who have been baptized in another denomination but are being called to be Catholic;
- Those who have been baptized but not fully initiated through Confirmation and Eucharist;
- Those who have received sacraments but have been away from the Church;
- Those who are practicing their Catholic faith but desire to know more. The common factor among these groups is the desire to know, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ through his Holy Catholic Church.

What does the process entail?

In the cluster that includes Cathedral of Christ the King, Holy Assumption, St. Anthony (Superior), St. Anthony (Lake Nebagamon), and St. William (Foxboro), RCIA includes two-hour weekly sessions on Thursday evenings. Individuals meet as a group with a dedicated team of adults. Each evening includes Scripture, a Catechism topic, and other interesting facets of the Church.

Does participation mean commitment?

Choosing to participate in the Thursday RCIA sessions does not mean that an individual has fully committed to the Catholic Church. Rather, the sessions are designed to assist individuals through the discernment process. No one commits until they are ready. That may take a few months or maybe a few years.

What's the first step?

When does RCIA begin?

The first session is Thursday, December 1. The group meets from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in Kress Hall.
