40 Cans for Lent 2023

Our Christ the King Council 16691 of the Knights of Columbus is again helping the St. Vincent de Paul food shelf with this year's **40 Cans for Lent**. Can you help us? As much as you are able, please consider 40 cans (or boxes or packages) for Lent. Here is a list of items requested by our St. Vincent de Paul food shelf for the 2023 Cathedral collection. This list has changed considerably from last year's list.

Please do not purchase or donate items in glass jars, as they could break and cause a big mess. Plastic jars (such as plastic peanut butter jars) are fine. Please do not provide fresh foods (such as bread and fresh vegetables and fruits) and items requiring refrigeration, and please do not donate expired or opened items.

The majority of people we provide food and toiletry items to do not have kitchens in which to cook nor pantries to keep food. The majority are living in shelters or hotels or are homeless. We do help those with homes too, but the greater need is for unhoused people and families. <u>That said, we ask for small sized items rather than family size or economy size (e.g., big jars of peanut butter, large containers of spaghetti sauce). Individual portioned and microwavable servings are especially needed.</u>

Donations can be brought to Cathedral between now and Holy Thursday. We anticipate that items will be on display on the steps to the stage in Kress Hall. **THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS DONATION! VIVAT JESUS!**
