WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes that we find in the Mass readings for the 24th Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading – Sirach 27:30-28:9

- While wrath and anger are hateful things, the sinner hugs them tight.
- If a person expects mercy and pardon for sins, enmity must be set aside.

Psalm – 103:1-4,9-12

- “The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion.”
- God pardons, heals, and redeems us out of kindness.

2nd Reading – Romans 14:7-9

- None of us lives or dies for oneself, but for the Lord.
- Christ has died and rose that he might be Lord of the dead and the living.

Gospel – Matthew 18:21-35

- When asked by Peter how often must he forgive his brother, Jesus offers a parable about a servant who failed to forgive someone in a small way after he had experienced great forgiveness from his master.
- The Lord then applies the parable to us all: we must forgive one another if we expect to be forgiven by God.

Question for Children: Jesus says we should forgive from our heart. When did you ask forgiveness of someone you hurt? How did you feel?

Question for Youth: Jesus challenges us to forgive. Who needs your forgiveness? From whom do you need to ask forgiveness?

Question for Adults: Jesus tells us to forgive seventy times seven, which means always and forever. Name a time this past week when you forgave someone. Name, too, a time when you accepted another person's forgiveness.

RCIA

RCIA is a process to bring adults to full communion with the Catholic Church. Locally, RCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves those with no faith affiliation, those from other faith denominations, Catholics seeking to receive Eucharist and Confirmation, and fully initiated Catholics who desire to learn more about their faith.

RCIA starts (November 16th) as soon as the ALPHA program ends. It includes prayer, Gospel/Scripture study & discussion, many theological topics, how the Church is organized, many opportunities to "learn the language", and ALWAYS time for questions. And of course, it wouldn't be Catholic if it didn't include refreshments and treats.

Superior Catholics RCIA meets on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30. A mix of in-person, virtual, and hybrid sessions are held. This allows us to bring in speakers from around the diocese, work around inclement winter weather, and be sensitive to those who travel long distances and night-vision issues.

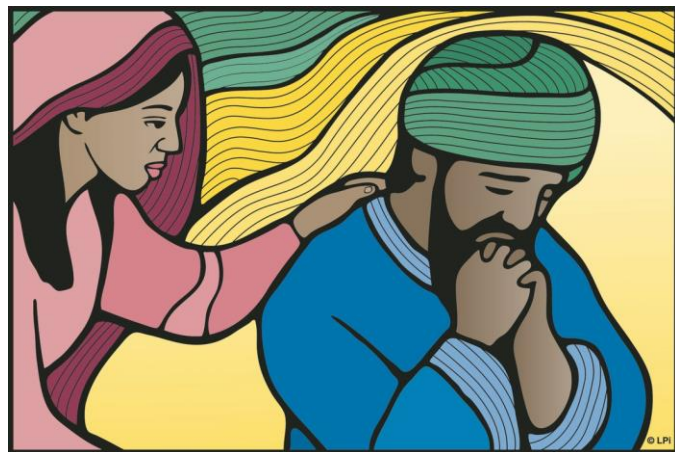

Hello there!

My name is Jacob, I'm 20 years old, and I live in South Range Wisconsin. I have been a member of the Catholic Church since baptism, a member of the Superior Diocese for 5 years, and within the past months I have been taking my faith much more seriously. You may have seen me serving mass, attending activities with the Youth Group, at Religious Ed/Confirmation class, or attending retreats. You may also recognize me with my mom and stepdad Virginia and Bill Kovaleski.

I have been looking for a way to live out my faith and my calling to serve while also bringing others to Christ. I first heard of NET Ministries a few years ago at a retreat put on by our youth group at Cathedral of Christ the King, and having heard the call to serve I decided the best place to go was NET Ministries. I am the only member from the Diocese of Superior this year, and one of only 3 ministry members from Wisconsin.

NET Ministries is a Non-Profit organization that is meant to bring the message of Christ to young Catholics through relational ministry. This year NET is sending out 14 teams, 120 Young adults from around the country, across the US to bring the message to 90 dioceses. There are two types of teams, Discipleship Teams, and Retreat Teams. The Discipleship teams are stationed in one place and enrich the community of young Catholics. The Retreat Team travels throughout the country putting on retreats, praying with, and bringing the message of Faith to every young person they meet. Since 1981 NET has reached 80% of US Dioceses and has hosted and lead over 36,000 retreats.

Every NET minister is asked to raise funds in order to help fund the mission, and the goal that each NET team member is asked to meet is \$3,500 by the start of training on August 16th, and then \$7,000 - \$8,000 minimum over the course of their mission. Yes, that may seem like a scary number but on average NET members raise \$10k - \$12k. It takes on average 30-32 members on a support team (donors) to fund a NET member, with donations on average ranging from \$50 - \$500 or you can pledge smaller monthly donations of \$10 - \$100 if you still want to support but can't at the moment. All donations are appreciated no matter the amount.

If you wish to donate you can online at <https://netusa.org/supportamissionary/>. You can choose to make a One-Time Gift, or you can Pledge to Give, and you can choose an amount just underneath. There will be a drop box on the webpage, click that and scroll until you see my name (Jacob Downey) and if it doesn't appear you can write it in the text box underneath. If you want to donate with cash and/or check there is an envelope that you can mail it to the NET themselves, just make the check out to NET Ministries and put my name in the memo line, make sure to leave the back side blank.

My adventure with NET started on August 16th and I have been so excited and thankful for the opportunity that I have been given to serve with NET. While yes, my time window to fundraise is slim, I know that God will provide if it is his will.
