

# WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's take a look at some of the themes in the Mass Readings for the 26th Sunday of the Year.

#### 1st Reading - Ezekiel 18:25-28

- When a person turns away from virtue to commit iniquity, it leads to death.
- When a person turns away from wickedness and does what is right and just, it leads to life.

#### Psalm - 25:4-9

- "Remember your mercies, O Lord."
- God makes known to us the path of life, showing sinners the way and leading the humble to justice.

#### 2nd Reading - Philippians 2:1-11

- We are urged to have the same attitude as Christ, who emptied himself and offered his life.
- Because of his sacrifice, every knee shall bow in heaven, on earth, and under the earth that Jesus Christ is Lord.

#### Gospel - Matthew 21:28-32

- Jesus offers a parable about a man who has two sons who say and do different things when asked.
- The Lord then points out that it is our actions (especially repentance) that reveal our relationship to God and one another.

**Question for Children:** How do you show your love for Jesus by doing what he asks, even when it is difficult for you?

**Question for Youth:** Today's parable reminds us that it isn't what we say that counts as much as what we do. How would someone know you are a Christian through your actions?

RCIA is a process to bring adults to full communion with the Catholic Church. Locally, RCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves those with no faith affiliation, those from other faith denominations, Catholics seeking to receive Eucharist and Confirmation, and fully initiated Catholics who desire to learn more about their faith.

RCIA starts (November 16<sup>th</sup>) as soon as the ALPHA program ends. It includes prayer, Gospel/Scripture study & discussion, many theological topics, how the Church is organized, opportunities to "learn the language", and ALWAYS time for questions. And of course, it wouldn't be Catholic if it didn't include refreshments and treats.

Superior Catholics RCIA meets on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30. A mix of in-person, virtual, and hybrid sessions are held. This allows us to bring in speakers from around the diocese, work around inclement winter weather, and be sensitive to those who travel long distances and night-vision issues.
