


## Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He said to one of

them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last." - Mt 20:13-16

## WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's explore some of the themes in the Mass Readings for the 25th Sunday of the Year.

#### 1st Reading - Isaiah 55:6-9

- Isaiah urges the people to seek and call upon the Lord while he is near.
- God's thoughts and ways and not like ours; like the heavens are high above the earth, so are God's ways high above our own.

#### Psalm - 145:2-3,8-9,17-18

- "The Lord is near to all who call upon him."
- God's goodness and kindness is revealed in the compassion extended to all creation.

#### 2nd Reading - Philippians 1:20c-24,27a

- Christ is magnified in our bodies, by life or by death.
- St. Paul is in conflict: death means that he will be with Christ; life means that he is able to serve Christ's people.

#### Gospel - Matthew 20:1-16a

 Jesus offers a parable about a landowner who is generous to the laborers who could not work a full day in his vineyard.

**Question for Children:** How do you experience God being generous to you: through your family, friends, school, or parish?

**Question for Youth:** This Gospel reminds us that God is always seeking us out and welcoming us into his generous love. Through whom has God reached out to you? Who is always encouraging you to say "yes" to God?

**Question for Adults:** Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words how God will treat those who come to be part of the church, even those who come late.

#### RCIA

RCIA is a process to bring adults to full communion with the Catholic Church. Locally, RCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves those with no faith affiliation, those from other faith denominations, Catholics seeking to receive Eucharist and Confirmation, and fully initiated Catholics who desire to learn more about their faith.

RCIA starts (November 16<sup>th</sup>) as soon as the ALPHA program ends. It includes prayer, Gospel/Scripture study & discussion, many theological topics, how the Church is organized, many opportunities to "learn the language", and ALWAYS time for questions. And of course, it wouldn't be Catholic if it didn't include refreshments and treats.

Superior Catholics RCIA meets on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30. A mix of in-person, virtual, and hybrid sessions are held. This allows us to bring in speakers from around the diocese, work around inclement winter weather, and be sensitive to those who travel long distances and night-vision issues.

Please consult the parish bulletin for specific dates. Those who choose to become fully initiated Catholics are welcomed in the glorious liturgy of Easter Vigil.


