

#### **WEEKLY MEDITATION**

Here are some of the main themes that we find in the Mass Readings for the 2nd Sunday of Lent.

#### 1st Reading - Genesis 22:1-2, 9,10-13,15-18

- God tests Abraham by telling him to offer up his son Isaac as a holocaust.
- Before Abraham can accomplish the task, God intervenes and blesses Abraham.

#### Psalm - 116:10.15-19

- "I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living."
- Even when we are afflicted, we serve the Lord with sacrifices of thanksgiving.

#### 2nd Reading - Romans 8:31b-34

- If God is for us, who can be against us? God acquits us.
- Jesus Christ, who died and was raised, intercedes for us.

#### Gospel - Mark 9:2-10

- Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain where he is transfigured before them.
- Elijah and Moses appear, and a voice comes from a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him."




