WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's examine some of the themes in the Mass readings on the 4th Sunday of Easter.

1st Reading - Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

- Peter addresses the people, stating that the healing miracle they have seen was done in the name of Jesus Christ.
- Raised from the dead, it is in his name that we have salvation.

Psalm - 118:1,8-9,21-23,26,28-29

- "The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone."
- This is the psalm that Peter quotes in the speech we just heard in Acts, proclaiming Jesus as the fulfillment of salvation history.

2nd Reading - 1st Letter of John 3:1-2

- Calling us "children of God," we perceive the love which the Almighty has bestowed upon us.
- What we will become is not known now, but when it is revealed, we will be like him and see him as he is.

Gospel - John 10:11-18

- Jesus claims that he is the "good shepherd" who knows, leads, defends, and lays down his life for the sheep.
- The Father has given Christ the power and command to lay down his life for the flock.

Mid-Year Report

Our fiscal year begins on October 1st. In the past six months we have helped nearly 800 households with information and referral, goods, and/or financial assistance. (727 for the same period last year). Of these households over 300 were homeless (last year 206), which is a significant increase. Last year, we met with people half of the time in conference calls and the remaining half face to face - in a similar number of contacts. In this current six-month period, our volunteers have visited people in their homes in a team of two 75 times and in the community 200 times. (in part due to the fact that many are experiencing homelessness). We are grateful for the dedicated efforts of our volunteers who transcribe calls, speak to people on the phone, and those who meet with people.





Robert 'Bob' Ahlborg was born to Edmond and Sophie Ahlborg in Superior on October 8, 1948. The oldest of four, he attended Cathedral School from 2nd Grade through graduation in 1966. His church service started at an early age, as he began serving as an altar boy in the sixth grade at 5:30 AM mass with Monsignor Kress. 
