WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's look at the themes we find in the Mass readings for the Epiphany of the Lord.

1st Reading - Isaiah 60:1-6

- Jerusalem will rise up and be filled with light as the glory of the Lord shines upon her.
- The nations shall come to the holy city, bringing wealth and riches to praise God.

Psalm - 72:1-2,7-8,10-13

- "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."
- God will endow the king with justice, and the nations of the earth shall serve him.

2nd Reading - Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6

- The mystery of God's revelation has been revealed through the apostles and those filled with the Holy Spirit.
- The Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, in the promise of faith in Jesus Christ.

- They are told to seek him in Bethlehem, and Herod requests that they inform him when he is found.
