#### **WEEKLY MEDITATION**

Let's explore some of the themes in the Mass readings for the 4th Sunday of Lent.

1st Reading - Joshua 5:9a,10-12

 On the plains of Jericho, the people celebrated the Passover and ate the fruit of the land, and on that same day the manna ceased.
