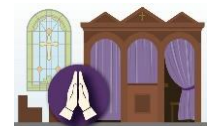
First Sunday of Lent

WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's examine some of the main themes that we find in the Mass readings for the 1st Sunday of Lent.

1st Reading - Deuteronomy 26:4-10

- Moses recalls God's mighty works that freed the people from slavery in Egypt.
- Inspired by this memory they now bring forth the first fruits of their produce to honor the Lord in the Promised Land.

Psalm - 91:1-2,10-15

- "Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble."
- We place our trust in God, who sustains us when we are in distress.

2nd Reading - Romans 10:8-13

- If we confess with the mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in our heart that God raised him, we will be saved.
- This salvation in Christ is available to all, there is no distinction between Jew and Greek.

Gospel - Luke 4:1-13

- Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit, is led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil.
- The Lord responds to the devil's temptations, quoting Scripture until the devil departs for a time.

Question for Adults: As you come to understand the temptation of Jesus in the desert, which one of the devil's offerings is hardest for you to resist?
