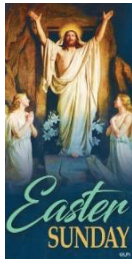

WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's review some of the main themes in the Mass readings for Easter Day.

1st Reading - Acts of the Apostles 10:34a,37-43

- Peter proclaims the life, death and resurrection of Jesus to the crowd.
- The disciples are witnesses of Christ and testify on his behalf for the forgiveness of sins.

Psalm 118: 1-2,16-17,22-23

- "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."
- We give thanks for the might and glory of God who is merciful to us.

2nd Reading - Colossians 3:1-4

- You have died with Christ, and your life is hidden with God.
- When Christ your life appears, you will appear with him in glory.

2nd Reading - 1st Corinthians 5:6b-8

- We clear out the old yeast of malice and wickedness.
- We make a new batch of dough with the new yeast of sincerity and truth.

Gospel - John 20:1-9

- Mary Magdalene finds the tomb empty and runs to tell Peter and the other disciple.
- Peter and the other disciple run back to the tomb.
- They had not yet understood that Jesus had to rise from the dead.

Carlo Acutis, the first Millennial Saint, movie showing locally

Carlo Acutis: Roadmap to Reality explores the life and legacy of the soon-to-be Saint Carlo Acutis and how he navigated the modern world. It tackles urgent technology-related questions, examining how the virtual landscape threatens our fundamental understanding of what it means to be human. The film also tracks the journey of a group of high school students who embark on a two-week pilgrimage from North Dakota to Italy to visit Carlo's tomb. A requirement for their pilgrimage: disengage from technology and leave their phones at home. The film features Carlo's family and friends sharing their firsthand experiences and his impact on their lives. It also includes well-known voices in the Catholic Church and technology experts who offer a model for young people to engage in the digital world.

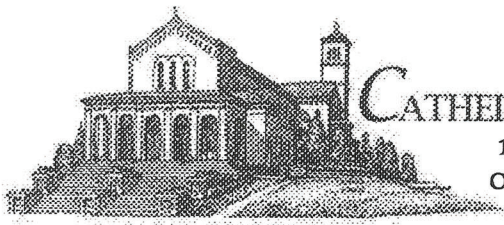

MARY JO (KETCHUM) EDGE

Mary Jo was born to military parents, between the horrors of World War II and the Korean War – Her mother, Sgt. Dorothy Pelletier met her father, Sgt. Lloyd Ketchum while serving with Army medical attachments in South Carolina, her father would later give his life in the Korean conflict in service of our country in 1950. This is to say that Mary Jo was destined in many ways for a life of service to others.

Education and faith were a formative part of Mary Jo's life from the very beginning. Mary Jo was brought up attending Saint Louis Grade School and later graduated from the class of 1967 from Cathedral School.

After graduation, she married her husband, Douglas Edge, and they welcomed their son Andy to the family in 1980.

The Edge family faithfully attended Saint Louis Parish until its closing in 1989 when they came to the Cathedral of Christ the King. While Saint Louis Parish closed its doors, Mary Jo has maintained close friendships with many of her former parishioners to this day.

Mary Jo went on to continue her life of service in 1992 when she became the long-standing housekeeper for the Cathedral Rectory, working for such memorable clergy as Fr. Ed Meulemans, Fr. John Gerrits, Fr. Jim Tobolski, Fr. John Anderson, Fr. Lee Flaherty and current Cathedral of Christ the King Rector, Fr. Andrew Ricci. As a housekeeper, Mary Jo got to know each priest very well and knew their specific dinner preferences, such as double meat on Fr. Meulemans plate- "hold the vegetables, because he wouldn't eat them anyway."

During her time as housekeeper, Janette Gil de Lamadrid would reach out to Mary Jo, asking for her help with the youth programs at Cathedral of Christ the King. When considering the call, she realized, "If everyone says no, who will do this?" Mary Jo went on to take on 10th grade religious ed, as well as helping with the TONs (Teens Only Night) youth group and the Ski Blast retreat for middle and high school students. Mary Jo loved "her kids," as she fondly remembers them and made every moment special. Many of Mary Jo's former "kids" will remember the Cathedral Cheeseballs she lovingly made to fundraise for the program for many years, and her boundless energy and enthusiasm. No one could forget Mary Jo, and she has not forgotten any of her "kids" either.

She retired from caring for the Cathedral Rectory after 13 years for her "higher calling" of being a grandmother, as her son Andy and his wife Sara welcomed her granddaughter, Alaina, but carried on her work with Youth Ministry for many years.

Mary Jo continued to live a life of service to the Church and to others as a Eucharistic Minister, and now leads the Prayer Chain Ministry, sharing the love of Christ through her indomitable positivity and occasionally a half-cup of black coffee in the mornings around the parish office table – to which she has never turned in her keys.

We are proud to honor Mary Jo's life of service to our church and to our community with the Lumen Christi award, recognizing her commitment to the values we are all called to as followers of Christ.
