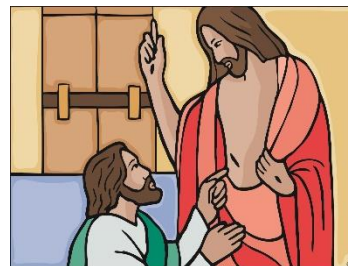

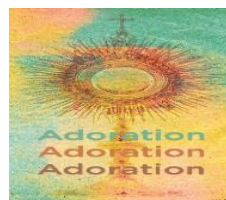

WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's explore some of the themes that we find in the 2nd Sunday of Easter.

1st Reading - Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16

- The apostles, esteemed by the people, perform signs and wonders of healing.
- Great numbers of men and women become believers in the Lord.

Psalm - 118:2-4,13-15,22-24

- "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting."
- Our strength and our courage come from the Lord, and we are glad and rejoice.

2nd Reading - Revelation 1:9-11a,12-13,17-19

- John experiences a glorious vision of the son of man who tells him to not be afraid, and says, "I once was dead, but now I am alive forever."
- John is commanded to write down what he has seen, including what is yet to come.

Gospel - John 20:19-31

- Jesus passes through locked doors and appears to the disciples saying, "Peace be with you."
- Thomas is absent from the meeting, and one week later Jesus appears to him and tells him to not be unbelieving, but believe.

Question for Children: Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they were afraid and locked in the closed room. How can you show Jesus to another person this week by how you act?

Question for Youth: Thomas didn't believe because he hadn't seen Jesus with his own eyes. How hard is it for you to believe in God without being able to see God? How do you see God in the words and actions of others?

Question for Adults: Jesus said: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." Give one example of how you will show your belief in Jesus this week - how you are being sent forth.

Carlo Acutis, the first Millennial Saint, movie showing locally

Carlo Acutis: Roadmap to Reality explores the life and legacy of the soon-to-be Saint Carlo Acutis and how he navigated the modern world. It tackles urgent technology-related questions, examining how the virtual landscape threatens our fundamental understanding of what it means to be human. The film also tracks the journey of a group of high school students who embark on a two-week pilgrimage from North Dakota to Italy to visit Carlo's tomb. A requirement for their pilgrimage: disengage from technology and leave their phones at home. The film features Carlo's family and friends sharing their firsthand experiences and his impact on their lives. It also includes well-known voices in the Catholic Church and technology experts who offer a model for young people to engage in the digital world.

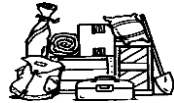
