## WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes that we find in the Mass readings for the 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Jeremiah 38:4-6,8-10

- Jeremiah is cast into a cistern at the threat of his enemies.
- Ebed-melech, a court official, pleads for his release and releases him from the cistern.

### Psalm – 40:2-4,18

- "Lord, come to my aid!"
- Afflicted and poor, the Lord draws us out from the pit of destruction.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – Hebrews 12:1-4

- Surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, we persevere in running the race with our eyes fixed on Jesus.
- We continue in our struggle against sin as we recall how Christ endured the Cross.

- The Lord comes to set a fire blazing upon the earth that will cause division, even among families.

## ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY



### HELPING THOSE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

Each month, on average, our Society has been receiving requests from 66 households experiencing homelessness.

Last November, our Society and several other organizations created a collaboration to help those who are homeless find shelter and more permanent housing. It is called Bridges of Superior. Member organizations are Superior Police Department, Douglas County Sheriff's Department, Faith United Methodist Church/Harbor House, and Job Service.

Your support and our collaboration have assisted a vet who lived in a tent for years to move into an apartment and a young disabled man who has been homeless since he was a teenager, now to have a sleeping room. These are only two examples of the impact our group has made in the lives of the poorest of the poor. There are no easy answers to addressing homelessness - but helping one person at a time with loving care and God's providence - is making a difference in our community.

In the summer months, monetary donations dwindle. If you are able, please consider a financial gift to help us assist our brothers and sisters in need.

# Becoming Catholic

There is something beautiful happening these days. More and more adults are seeking information about the Holy Catholic Church. The excitement and energy is very real.

The process of bringing adults into full communion with the Catholic Church is called the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* (formerly the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*). Locally, OCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves those with no faith-based experience to those fully Catholic desiring to learn more about the basics of their faith.



There are varying ways to participate in OCIA. First, there are weekly classes on Thursday evenings. Gathered together are individuals with a wide range of faith-based experiences. The sessions are led by a team of experienced Catholics. Each session examines scripture, portions of the Catechism, and topics designed to help navigate ordinary Catholic experiences.

Second, recognizing that life does not always allow for a weekly on-site commitment, arrangements can be made for individuals to independently study the materials with monthly visits with an OCIA team member.

Participation in OCIA is beneficial for people in many situations:

- Those with no faith-based experience.
- Those from other denominations who feel that they are being called to the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics who would like to complete their Sacraments of Initiation.
- Non-Catholics who are married to a Catholic and would like to learn more about their spouses' faith.
- Fully initiated Catholics who feel that their understanding of the basics of the Catholic Church is dated and/or incomplete.

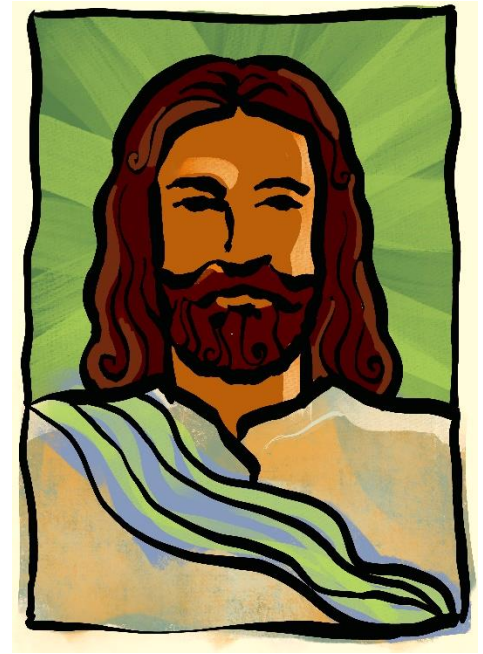

# To Know, Love, and Serve Him:

## Adult Formation Programming

“To Know, Love and Serve Him” are words that were published in 1885 in the first edition of the Baltimore Catechism in response to the question, “Why did God make you?” Even though this question and response has been part of Catholic culture for 140 years – and things have changed so much – it is still very relevant today.

How do we know, love and serve God in this complicated world of ours? It’s not always easy. But consider the progression of these three words: KNOW – LOVE – SERVE. The collective wisdom of the bishops\* who created this text put these words in this order on purpose. They knew that to love and serve God, we first need to know Him.

\*The Baltimore Catechism was developed by the Catholic bishops of the United States in response to the tremendous influx of European immigrants in the mid-1800s. The simple question and answer format helped with the diversity of languages and educational levels.
