WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's examine some of the themes that we discover in the Mass readings for the 23rd Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Wisdom 9:13-18b

- Human lives are mortal, limited, and comprehend with difficulty.
- God's counsel in heaven transcends our reach.

Psalm - 90:3-6,12-17

- "In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge."
- We call upon the Almighty, for we are dust and merely a moment in God's sight.

2nd Reading - Philemon 1:9-10,12-17

- Paul, an old man and a prisoner, sends Onesimus back to Philemon.
- Although Onesimus was a slave, Paul asks that he be received as a beloved brother.

Gospel - Luke 14:25-33

- Jesus speaks to the crowds, reminding them that to follow him means putting aside one's own life.
- The Lord offers the examples of waging war and a construction project in order to make it clear that they must know the cost of discipleship before they commit to Christ.

Question for Children: Jesus says that in order to be one of his followers, we must be close to him. When do you feel closest to Jesus?

Question for Youth: Jesus tells his disciples that they must renounce their possessions in order to be His disciple. If you had to, could you leave everything behind to be with God? What would hold you back? How much of a struggle would it be?

Question for Adults: Today's Gospel is demanding. How do you as a modern man or woman "denounce your possessions?" What does this mean for you?

Are you ready to live

What does it cost to be a disciple of Jesus?

Christianity is not an organization that assesses dues once a year, like a fitness club that sends an email reminder when it is time to renew membership. And unlike joining a gym, making a commitment to live as a disciple is not about looking for the option that is the least expensive. The truth is, when we take the call of discipleship to heart, we realize that living as a follower of Jesus **costs** something. In fact, the more deeply we commit ourselves to our Lord, the greater the impact our faith will have. "It is costly because it requires a disciple for Jesus' sake to put aside the craving for domination, possession, and control, and grace because it confers true liberation and eternal life." (SDR, p. 15)

**"Whoever does not carry his own cross
and come after me cannot be my disciple."**

—Luke 14:27

What is the cost of discipleship? Each of us responds to the Lord personally and discerns how we will respond to Christ's call to love and serve. There are common aspects of this way of life:

Disciples put God first, choosing God's and God's ways above all others. Disciples pray; make a commitment to follow Jesus and to grow in relationship with him; consider and respond to the needs of others, especially the poor and those in need of great care. Disciples go out of their way for the sake of others. Disciples sacrifice, because Jesus sacrificed himself for our salvation. Disciples turn away from the temptation to be self-centered and selfish, and instead give of themselves and their resources in order to make Christ's love known.

"Refracted through the prisms of countless individual vocations, this way of life embodies and expresses the one mission of Christ: to do God's will, to proclaim the Good News of salvation, to heal the afflicted, to care for one's sisters and brothers, to give life—life to the full—as Jesus did." (Stewardship: A Disciple's Response, p. 14)

A prayer Rite for Entrance into the Catechumenate

Receive the cross of Christ:

- On your forehead. Christ himself strengthens you with the sign of his love. Learn to know him and follow him.
- On your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord.
- On your eyes, that you may see the glory of God.
- On your lips, that you may respond to the word of God.
- On your chest, that Christ may dwell in your heart by faith.
- On your shoulders, that you may bear the gentle yoke of Christ.
- On your hands, that Christ may be known in the work which you do.
- On your feet, that you may walk in the way of Christ.



AT A CROSSROADS

The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated on September 14, provides a reminder that throughout our lives, in every circumstance, **we are to turn to the cross, and the love of Christ which the cross signifies.**

On the cross, Jesus gave completely of himself. He held nothing back. And as a result, we have gained everything: salvation, mercy, forgiveness, love, and hope.

We are not to be passive recipients of these great gifts! The cross boldly

beckons us to take up the life of

the steward which Jesus so completely models. Having been given much, we must give greatly in return, by sharing our faith, time, resources, and talents. At times, such giving will make us uncomfortable; we may risk rejection and we will be called to sacrifice. Jesus' undying love on the cross calls each of us to give without counting the cost, to find life by holding nothing back.

Each of us bears a different cross, and bears our crosses differently. For some, the cross is the burden of loss or illness, unemployment, disappointment, or loneliness. For others, the cross is the realization of God's great love for humanity, and the recognition of how we are called to love greatly in return. At times, we take up our cross willingly, but often, our crosses are thrust upon us.

We may find ourselves at a crossroads, called to choose how we will respond to the circumstances of this particular moment in time. We must take up our cross with God's grace, understanding that Jesus freely bore his cross, and walks with us as we strive to bear ours.

The cross also reminds us that the resurrection awaits those who willingly enter into Christ's passion and death as disciples and stewards. In dying to self, we rise with Christ to new life. In giving as good stewards, we share the life and light of Christ with the world.

Becoming Catholic

There is something beautiful happening these days. More and more adults are seeking information about the Holy Catholic Church. The excitement and energy is very real.

The process of bringing adults into full communion with the Catholic Church is called the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* (formerly the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*). Locally, OCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves those with no faith-based experience to those fully Catholic desiring to learn more about the basics of their faith.



There are varying ways to participate in OCIA. First, there are weekly classes on Thursday evenings. Gathered together are individuals with a wide range of faith-based experiences. The sessions are led by a team of experienced Catholics. Each session examines scripture, portions of the Catechism, and topics designed to help navigate ordinary Catholic experiences.

Second, recognizing that life does not always allow for a weekly on-site commitment, arrangements can be made for individuals to independently study the materials with monthly visits with an OCIA team member.

Participation in OCIA is beneficial for people in many situations:

- Those with no faith-based experience.
- Those from other denominations who feel that they are being called to the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics who would like to complete their Sacraments of Initiation.
- Non-Catholics who are married to a Catholic and would like to learn more about their spouses' faith.
- Fully initiated Catholics who feel that their understanding of the basics of the Catholic Church is dated and/or incomplete.

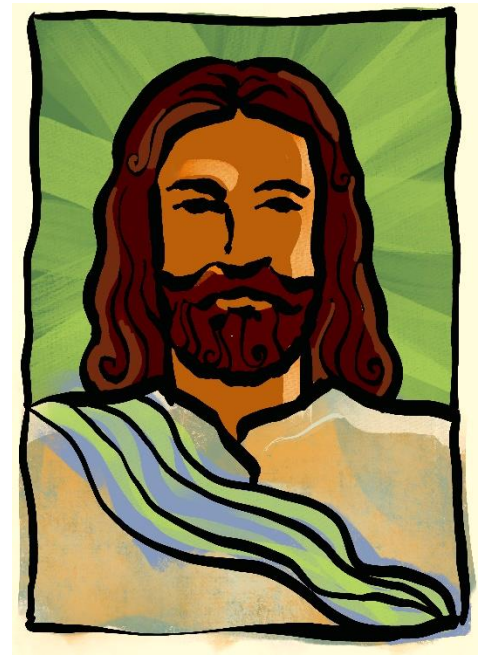

To Know, Love, and Serve Him:

“To Know, Love and Serve Him” are words that were published in 1885 in the first edition of the Baltimore Catechism in response to the question, “Why did God make you?” Even though this question and response has been part of Catholic culture for 140 years – and things have changed so much – it is still very relevant today.

How do we know, love and serve God in this complicated world of ours? It’s not always easy. But consider the progression of these three words: KNOW – LOVE – SERVE. The collective wisdom of the bishops* who created this text put these words in this order on purpose. They knew that to love and serve God, we first need to know Him.

*The Baltimore Catechism was developed by the Catholic bishops of the United States in response to the tremendous influx of European immigrants in the mid-1800s. The simple question and answer format helped with the diversity of languages and educational levels.

Wednesday Night Religious Education – Cathedral of Christ the King – Grades K-Confirmation – 2025-26

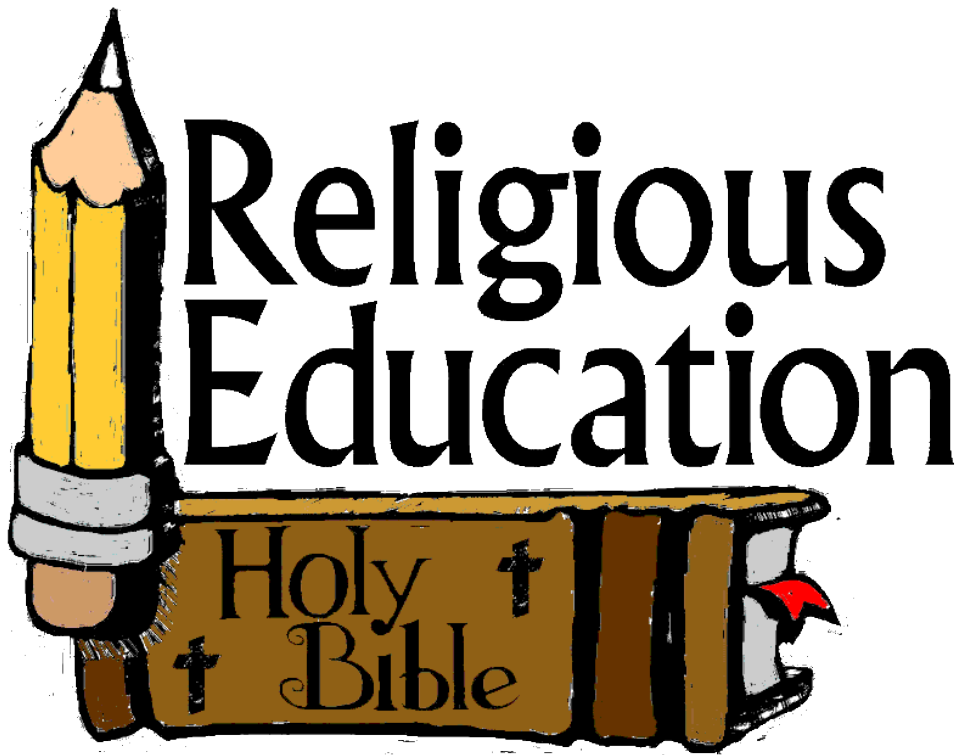

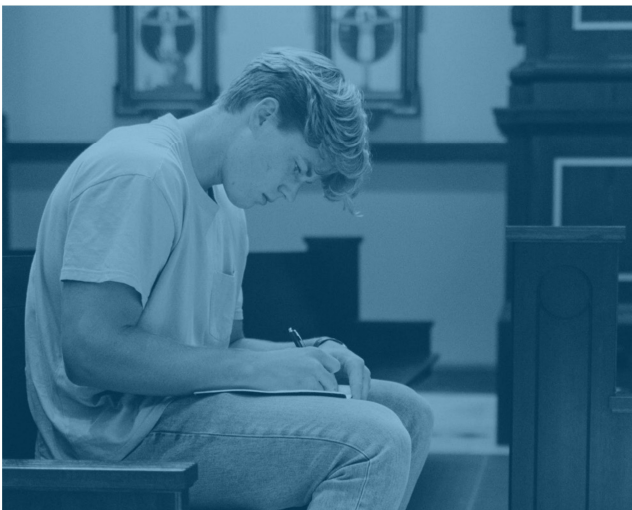
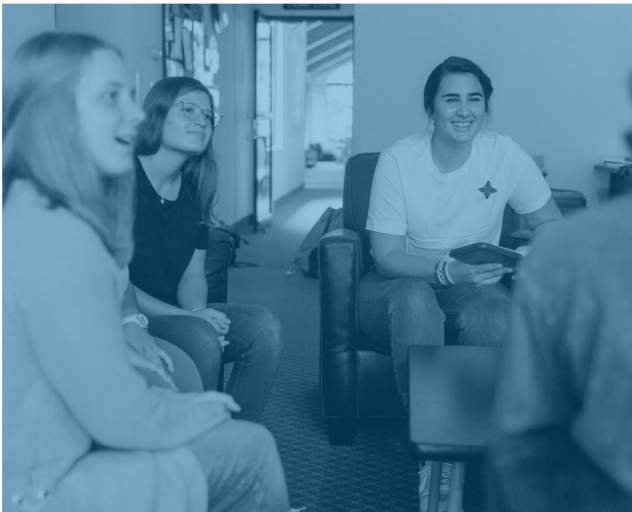
