### **WEEKLY MEDITATION**

Let's review the themes that we discover in the Mass readings for the 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year.

### 1st Reading - Amos 8:4-7

- Amos calls out those who cheat and steal from the poor.
- The Lord has sworn that this injustice will never be forgotten.

### Psalm - 113:1-2,4-8

- "Praise the Lord, who lifts up the poor."
- The Lord, enthroned in heaven, raises up the lowly and seats them with the princes of his own people.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 1<sup>st</sup> Timothy 2:1-8

- We are exhorted to pray for those in authority, that we might lead a quiet and tranquil life.
- The one mediator between God and humanity, Jesus Christ, gave himself as a ransom for all.

### **Gospel – Luke 16:1-13**

- Jesus offers a parable to his disciples about a dishonest steward who squandered his master's property.
- The Lord tells us that we cannot serve two masters; we must choose between God and mammon.
