#### **WEEKLY MEDITATION**

Here are some of the themes that we find in the Mass readings for the 26th Sunday of the Year.

#### 1st Reading - Amos 6:1a,4-7

- Amos calls out the wealthy and complacent, who have overlooked the collapse of the people.
- Their wanton revelry will be done away with, and they will be the first to go into exile.

#### Psalm - 146:7-10

- "Praise the Lord, my soul"
- God protects and sustains all those in need.

#### 2nd Reading - 1st Timothy 6:11-16

- Timothy is urged to live virtuously as he holds firm in his faith.
- Jesus Christ, King of kings and Lord of lords, has all honor and eternal power.

#### Gospel - Luke 16:19-31

- Jesus offers the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, revealing the reversal of fortune in the afterlife.
- In the parable Christ notes that if people do not listen to "Moses and the prophets" they will not believe, even if someone should rise from the dead.

**Question for Children:** Jesus teaches us to share what we have with others. What do you have that you are able to share?

**Question for Youth:** The Gospel story tells us that we are judged by what we do or don't do for the poor and needy. How are you currently reaching out to those in need? What more could you do?

**Question for Adults:** What choices can you or have you made to balance your own life with those who are homeless, poor and in need of assistance for daily living? How does this Gospel reading inform you about that?
