WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes that surface in the Mass readings for the 1st Sunday of Advent.

1st Reading – Isaiah 2:1-5

- The mountain of the Lord shall be the highest mountain, and people shall come toward it.
- On this mountain will be peace among the nations.

Psalm - 122: 1-9

- "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."
- We rejoice and pray that Jerusalem is a city of peace and prosperity.

2nd Reading – Romans 13:11-14

- The hour is at hand to awake from sleep; salvation is near.
- We put on the Lord Jesus Christ, throwing off the works of darkness and putting on the armor of light.

Gospel - Matthew 24:37-44

- Referring to the time of Noah, Jesus urges the people to be ready for the coming of the Son of Man.
- Christ calls us to be prepared, for at an unexpected hour the Son of Man will come.
