WEEKLY MEDITATION

Let's explore some of the themes in the readings for the 5th Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Isaiah 58:7-10

- The prophet exhorts the people to corporal works of mercy: sharing food; sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, responding to the needs of others.
- The Lord responds to us when we care for others, and the Lord's light shines upon us.

Psalm - 112:4-9

- "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright."
- Light shines upon those who care for the needs of others.

2nd Reading - 1st Corinthians 2:1-5

- Paul reminds the people that he came to them speaking of Christ crucified.
- He gave the message simply and without demonstrations of power, so that they would trust in God alone.

Gospel - Matthew 5:13-16

- Jesus teaches that we are salt and light, meant to use what we have been given for the good of others.
- When we let our light shine, we give glory to our heavenly Father.

Jesus' words in this month's gospels are **challenging**: Turn the other cheek. Love your enemies. Forgive and be reconciled. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Pray for those who persecute you. Be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Discipleship can be demanding, yet following Jesus is also freeing. In faith, we learn to let go of the constant pursuit of things that do not last. Our lives are less filled with conflict and more focused on things that matter. We have greater perspective, an eternal perspective, in all life's circumstances. When we are tempted to turn away from God's ways and instead turn toward the Lord, we find peace and fulfillment on the path of holiness.

BE SALT AND LIGHT.

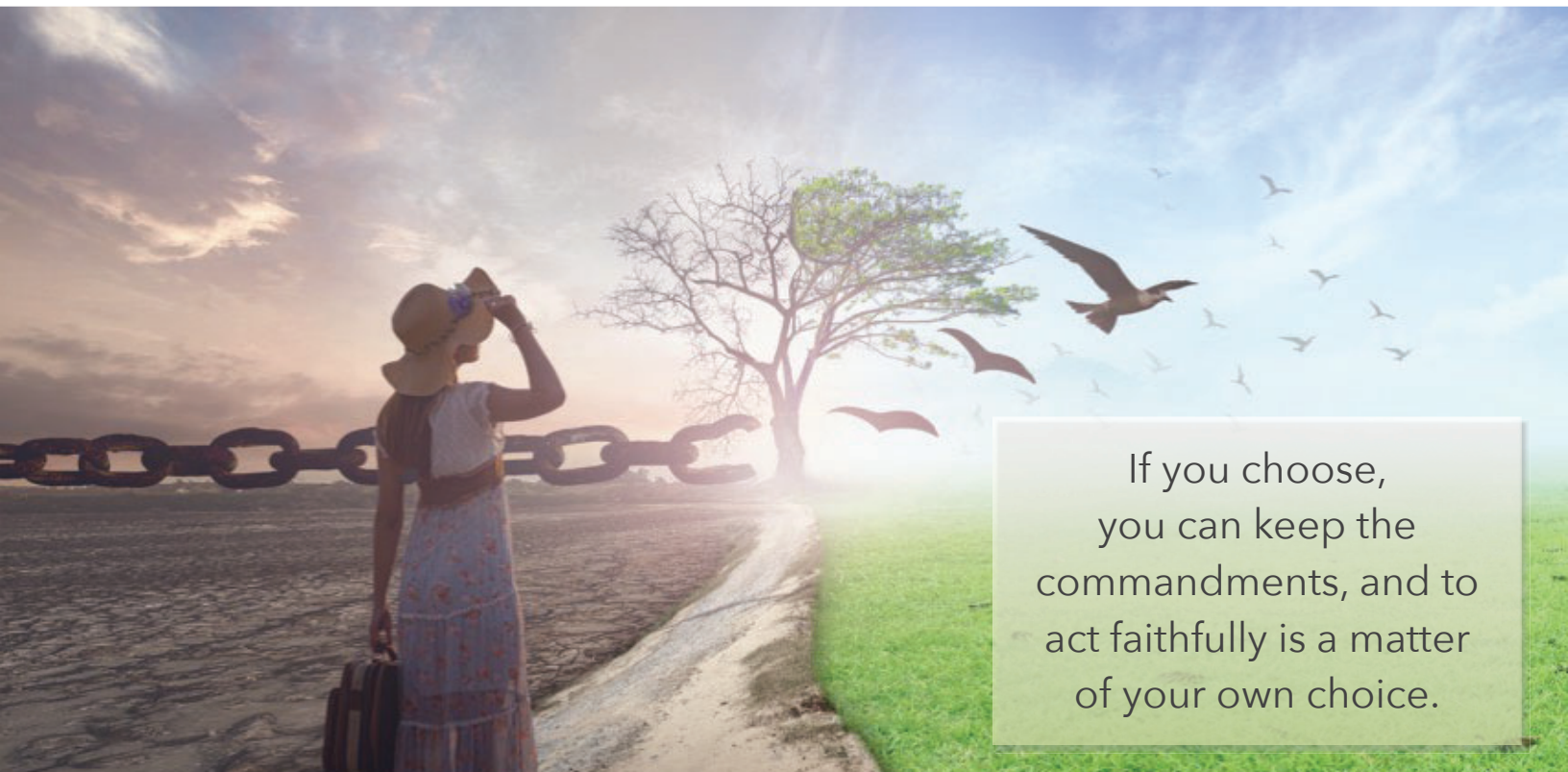
We all have times when we are stressed and tired or make our way through life without enthusiasm. The first disciples who walked with Jesus probably had those days as well. They may have grown weary on the journey. They might have missed their former lifestyle and questioned their decision to follow Jesus. Jesus encouraged them, challenged them, and urged them to stay on the path of faith, knowing that doing so is the way of truth and life, life filled with grace and meaning.

"You are the salt of the earth," "You are the light of the world," Jesus said. Jesus wants his disciples to be alive in faith, transformed by the Holy Spirit. As people empowered with the Spirit, we may add rich flavor and light where life is dull, lackluster, exhausting, dark.

THE CHOICE IS YOURS.

Before you are life and death, good and evil. Our Sunday readings this month, including this strong message from the book of Sirach, urge us to choose to be the people God desires, to strive toward selflessness, generosity, forgiveness, and mercy.

As disciples, when we bring faith to life, we are filled with purpose, sharing in Christ's mission to transform the world through selfless love. We are called to live faith deeply, boldly, showing others the impact of our belief and trust in the Lord in our daily lives. Choosing to live as Christ's own in the world is demanding and at the same time, it is the way of perfect love. The choice is yours. Whichever you choose will be given you.

Impact this month

Lent is a time for spiritual spring cleaning. Be resolved to grow in faith and discipleship.

Many of us made resolutions to bring order to our lives in the new year. In January, television and social media feeds were flooded with "hacks" for cleaning and organizing our homes and routines. Now is the perfect time to apply some of those tips as we make and fulfill our Lenten resolutions, bringing the order of discipleship to our daily lives.

Clean: Spend time in prayer. Invite the Lord to enlighten your mind and heart, showing you what needs to change in your life. Clear away the clutter of distraction and unnecessary activity in order to focus on God and more readily hear the call of the Lord. Participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation as you turn away from sin and return to the Gospel.

Organize: Establish stronger habits of faith by using the three Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and charity as a guide.

One Step at a Time: Rather than setting unreachable goals, begin small and build on your experience. Challenge yourself to take a deeper step each week of the Lenten season.

Choose and Be a Companion: Form a partnership with a family member or friend. Pray for each other. Hold one another accountable.

Cenacle Prayer Group

Would you like to be part of a faith sharing small group? Are you looking for a weekly opportunity to pray and reflect on how God is working in your life, but in a way that respects your time and is both focused and positive? Our cluster is looking for people who want to grow together in faith through a Cenacle prayer group.

Cenacle – a faith sharing small group (it refers to the “Upper Room” where the disciples met.)

Cenacle Key Points

The group is ideally composed of 4-7 people.

Each week, a different person in the group leads the Cenacle.

The group meets weekly (with rare exceptions based on holidays and life situations).

The Cenacle lasts between 30-60 minutes; it never goes beyond an hour.

The group can meet in person or digitally

- If in person, do it at a regular time that suits everyone (after Mass, over coffee, at home, etc.)
- If online, use what works for your group (FaceTime, Google Meet, a Zoom call, etc.)

Cenacle Format – THIS IS WHAT YOU ACTUALLY DO

- Opening Prayer (1-2 minutes)
 - Led by whoever is leading the meeting that week; when in doubt, use the Our Father!
- Check in with each other (10-15 minutes)
 - Each person takes 2-4 minutes (never more than 5!) to share events from the past week
- Reflection (15-30 minutes)
 - Sunday Gospel Reading
 - The Gospel is read out loud
 - People share something (a word/phrase/image) that touched them from the reading
- Goals for the coming week (10-15 minutes)
 - Each person takes 2-3 minutes to share their goals and objectives for the coming week.
- Closing Prayer
 - Each person names any specific prayer intentions that they have.
 - The Leader offers a concluding prayer; if you're not sure what prayer to use, say the Hail Mary!

Hallmarks of a healthy Cenacle

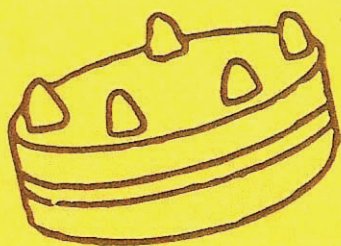
- Positivity – the focus is always on personal growth when sharing struggles; “venting” is to be avoided.
- Vulnerability – requires participants to be real in their joys and burdens.
- Leadership – group is accountable: gossip, toxic behaviors, being present, not monopolizing time, etc.
- Investment – participants make the Cenacle a priority and are thoughtfully present and prepared.

Who can join?

- Anyone! What's required is someone who wants to make a weekly commitment to grow in faith.
- In fact, if you connect each week on a Zoom call, you can be anywhere in the world!
 - Note: the big thing is that people make this a priority in their lives.
 - Once a week, they come together to pray, reflect, and support each other.
 - It's not complicated, but over time we find ourselves growing closer to God and each other.

Choose a Group Leader and connect with Fr. Andrew to begin

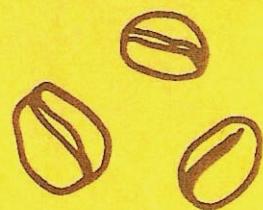

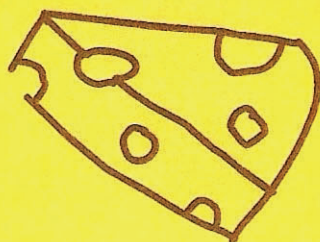
