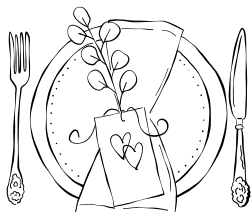
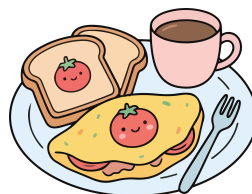

Here are some of the key themes that surface in the readings for the 5th Sunday of Easter.

### **1st Reading - Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7**

Seven reputable men are appointed to assist with the Christian community grows. Freed from these tasks, the Apostles continue to focus their efforts on prayer and the ministry of the word.

### **Psalm - 33:1-2,4-5,18-19**

"Lord, let your mercy be upon us, as we place our trust in you."  
We rejoice in the kindness and justice of the Lord, who preserves those who fear him.

### **2nd Reading-1stPeter2:4-9**

Christ, "the stone that the builders rejected, has become the cornerstone, "calls us to become living stones that are built up into God's spiritual house. We are chosen by God, called to offer our lives by the one leads us out of darkness into his wonderful light.

### **Gospel - John 14:1-12**
